Our School: What We Want It to Be Like

Be Safe: We look after ourselves and others by making good choices and using equipment properly. We keep our environment clean and safe for everyone.

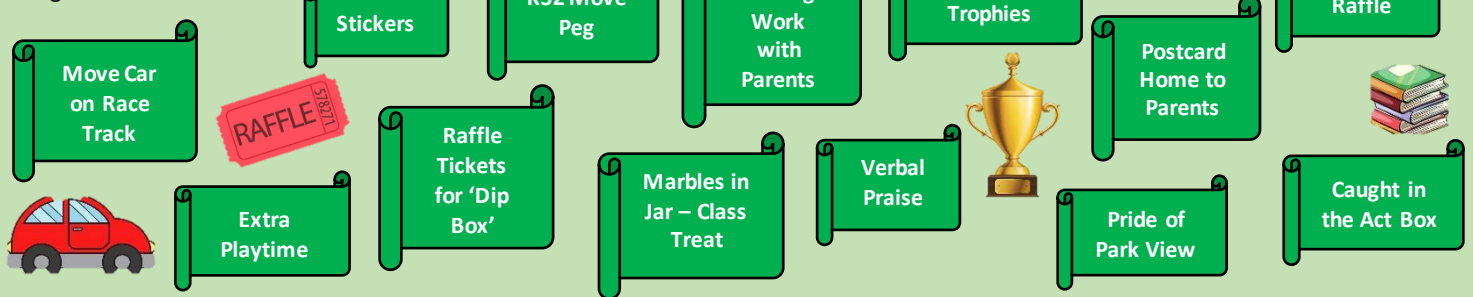
Be Kind: We treat everyone with care and compassion. We use positive words, help each other, and never hurt or bully others.

We get rewards like...



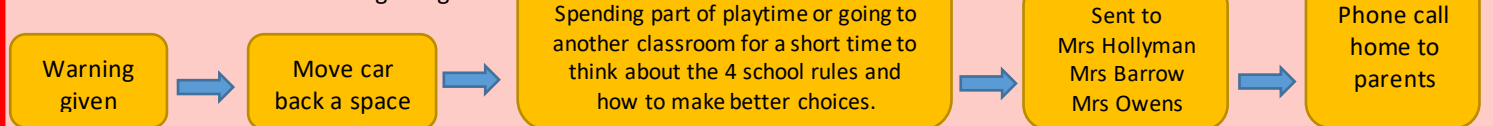
Examples of not acting appropriately....

- Not doing as the adults say or not following instructions
- Refusal to do activities or tasks
- Being disruptive in class and stopping children learning
- Choosing unsafe behaviour –throwing, fighting, standing on furniture
- Calling out, interrupting or talking over people
- Hurting people physically or mentally
- Using unkind words or prejudicial language
- Leaving the classroom without permission
- Breaking or ruining others' or school's property
- Threatening and intimidating behaviours
- Lying

KS1 Behaviour Race Track-

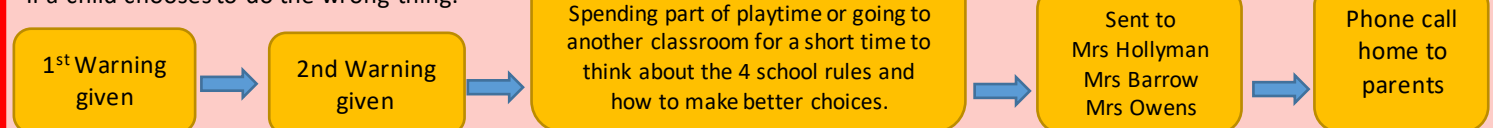
If a child chooses to do the wrong thing:

Our approach to behaviour is rooted in reflection and restoration. While we have a clear system for addressing inappropriate behaviour, our ethos focuses on helping children understand the impact of their actions and repair relationships. This policy does not list fixed consequences because responses are tailored to the situation. Beyond the actions outlined above, further responses are restorative and aim to support learning and growth.

All children are different and need different things. Some children have their own behaviour plan. This plan shows what helps them, what rewards they can get, and what happens if they don't follow the rules. Their plan might look different from other children's plans so they can do their best.
