Mrs Lennard will also be in my class

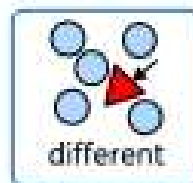
Here are things that will stay the same:

Here are things that will be different:

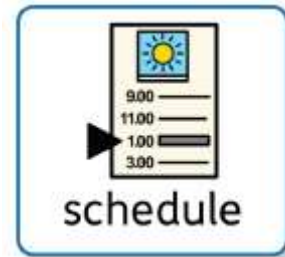


- My teacher's name will be Mrs Johnson.

Where I can put my things:

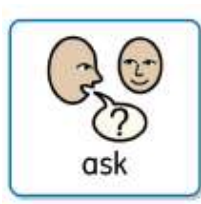
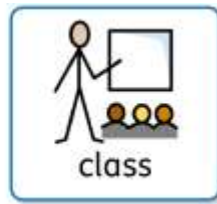
- In the lockers outside our classroom - I will be given my new locker on the first day after the summer holiday.

The things that we will probably do on the first day back:



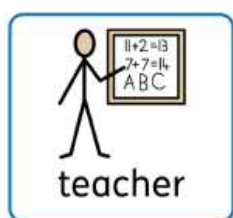
During the first couple of days back we will be doing lots of exciting activities and games that will help us get to know each other and help you know what to do in Year 5. You will also:
