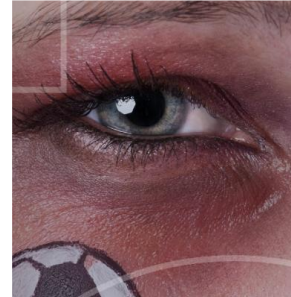

When the game begins, know where to turn

Major football tournaments bring people together, but for some, they also bring increased risk.

Domestic abuse can escalate during high-profile matches. Research and local data consistently show that incidents of domestic abuse rise around major men's football events, with reports increasing by around 25% following matches - regardless of whether the team wins, loses or draws.

This campaign aims to raise awareness, support those affected and encourage everyone to take action.

Safety Planning

Safety planning is a practical way to help reduce risk and prepare for different situations.

A safety plan might include:

- Identifying safe places you can go in an emergency
- Keeping important items ready (keys, phone, medication, important documents)
- Setting up a code word with a trusted friend or family member
- Planning how to leave safely if needed
- Thinking about safer times to seek help
- Ensuring your phone is charged and accessible
- Learning how to quickly leave a situation if you need to

Water Safety

Water safety is an important message for children of all ages. Tragically, drowning remains one of the leading causes of accidental death in children, and incidents in England have increased in recent years.

Accidental drowning can happen in a wide range of everyday places, including:

- At home (baths, hot tubs, ponds, private or paddling pools)
- Public swimming pools
- Open water such as the sea, rivers, lakes and canals

Children under the age of five, and teenagers aged 13–17, are particularly at risk.

While water-related incidents can occur at any time of year, almost half happen during the summer months when temperatures rise. Research also highlights an increased risk for older children and teenagers during very warm weather, especially when temperatures reach 25°C or above.

To support children's understanding, we are pleased to welcome Kim Chapman Swimming School on 16th June, who will deliver a Drowning Prevention Assembly in school.

As parents and carers, you play a vital role in keeping children safe around water. Most drowning accidents are preventable with the right knowledge and awareness. We strongly encourage you to access the helpful guidance and resources shown below by clicking here:
